

THE TRACK TRAILER CAMPER / GST64 TRAILER TOURING SYSTEM.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

The TRACK TRAILER CAMPER/GST64 combination was conceived as a highly viable and inherently flexible alternative to the more conventional "purpose", or "custom built" solutions.

The locker system makes the difference. Weather and dust proof, constructed out of galvanized steel and finished in powder coat baked enamel, it offers unrivalled storage volume and accessibility and eliminates what was formerly, a major disadvantage of trailer touring.

The camper system will adapt to almost any conventional or heavy duty 6x4 trailer. When ordered with the GST64 trailer, it can be removed allowing the trailer to earn its keep as a farm trailer, a tradesmans trailer or the best "garden trailer" on the block.

The GST64 trailer is fully hot dip galvanized after fabrication guaranteeing long life, nil maintenance and long term value for your investment. As subsequent welding would spoil the integrity of this lifetime finish and to eliminate the "special build" factor, the standard trailer has been continually modified in anticipation and acknowledgement of varying user requirements. The range of optional equipment (refer brochure) now either "plug-in" or "bolt on" and can be ordered with your unit or supplied at a later date. Any of these specially developed options will enhance the already out-standing performance and function of the basic system.

The Army has purchased a trailer and has carried out extensive testing at their Monegeetta test course near Puckapunyal in Victoria. Our trailer has survived initial testing loaded to its rated 1.3 tonnes. Their procedure is to force failures so testing is now proceeding with the trailer loaded beyond rating.

There are now over 50 of our trailers on the road and no suspension or structural deterioration or failure has been reported. This is quite an achievement as most of our units head for the outback soon after delivery.

A kitchen system is being developed to work in conjunction with our "butterfly" top option. Fully developed this alternative to the camper system will include an awning over the kitchen side of the unit. Ron Moon of 4x4 AUSTRALIA mag. is currently (June 90) evaluating the prototype on a Cape York trip.
